I also sent one & in that letter spoke principally of Mr Connally's health &c &c. altho' in unwatched health myself, I said but little of self. I am now compelled to bring before you my own feeble health, since writing you I have been perfectly prostrate from the anxiety & excitement. I feel & am now writing you confined to my bed & scarcely able to hold up my head.

Gen Moore again let me entreat you let my husband come

home, - My disease is Neuralgia
of the Heart, which as you well
know gives its victims but little
warning of its fatal approach

I asked my Physician to write
me a statement of my case
which I send you, tho' I see
for fear of alarming me
he has not stated the seat
of my disease, but which I
already know too well from
other Physicians & as well as from
what he has informed others.

I feel I can no longer bear
this intense excitement, I now
write you in Despair of self

Will you dear Sir let him
come home - I would try &
plead with you but - am
too feeble & suffering too much

A multiplicity of words
seem unnecessary, for your
heart's sympathy can but

feel my hearts bitterness
- Oh! live by your happiness
& my misery - by your power
& my helplessness - by our
common human nature,
I implore you once more
say but the word, Pardoned

And now I will close
by correcting a mistake in
my letter already sent, which
ambtless you have received
as I learn Your Excellency
will be in Montgomery the
last of this week - I spoke
of a petition or petitions for
other Counties which had been
sent - You will from an
enclosed letter from Judge
Hewlett, learn all about them
The Counties are so far
apart ^{tho'} that it is very difficult
to attend to the matter as we
desire, but - dear Sir you

Know enough to be Judge
of this very trying case. Let
me implore you give us a
Speedy answer -
