

To Hon A B Moore Governor of the State of Alabama

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Barber County respectfully sheweth unto your Excellency that Elijah Nolin was convicted at Springfield 1859 of assault & battery upon the person of one Edward Houston & fined in the sum of fifty dollars; that ~~said fine was~~ the conviction in the sum of fifty dollars was <sup>paid</sup> upon the testimony of Edward Houston alone; that since said trial it has been made to appear that said Edward Houston was one of those engaged in, or accessory to the murder of James Orr & that now a majority of the citizens of the immediate vicinity as well as of the County would not believe said Houston in his oath: that it was in evidence that not long preceding the alleged assault & battery said Houston had offered an indignity to the wife of said Nolin; & but for the reason that no other was present excepting said Nolin & Houston said Nolin was not able to ~~make~~ prove the cause of the difficulty, as said Houston would not testify that said indignity was the cause of quarrel; that said Elijah Nolin is a very poor man & that <sup>it will operate heavily upon him to</sup> ~~payment of~~ this fine with a large bill of costs unnecessarily produced by said Edward Houston who was prosecutor - For the reasons aforesaid petitioners pray your Excellency to remit said fine & costs & we will ever pray &c.
