The State  
vs  
Anthony, Pack  
Ben & Prince Slaves } came the State by the attorney  
General, and the Defendants in  
their own persons, and by their attor-  
-nies, and after hearing the charge  
of the Court, the jury retired to consider  
of their verdict, and afterwards came said jury into Court  
and say on their oaths that they find the Defendants guilty  
of an assault with intent to kill as charged in the  
Indictment; but unanimously recommend the Defendants  
to Executive Clemency for pardon.

And the jurors aforesaid  
being sworn well and truly to assest the value of said  
Slaves, and to Enquire if the owner of said Slaves was to  
blame for the offence committed: On their oath do  
say that they find said Slaves to be the property of Jackson  
Harrison and assest the value of Pack at fifteen hundred  
dollars, the value of Prince fifteen hundred dollars  
the value of Ben thirteen hundred dollars and the value  
of Anthony Twelve hundred dollars: and they further  
find that the said Jackson Harrison the owner of  
said Slaves was to blame for the offence committed  
as charged in the Indictment
