

Clayton Ala Augt 10. 1859.

To His Excellency,

A. B. Moore Governor &c.

Sir,

Herewith I hand you
other papers in connection with my application
heretofore made for the release & pardon of Jacob
Parmen a convict from this County now in
the Penitentiary.

I hope you will pardon me if
you should think I am at all troublesome
to you in this matter. It is a case in which
I feel a personal interest & hope as a personal
favor to me you will give the case as
favorable a consideration as it is in your
power to do. I appreciate your position
in all matters of this kind I have never before
troubled you, and I do assure you now
upon my word as a gentleman I do
believe this is a case in which your power
and clemency ought to be interposed.

I have been informed & believe that there
is not a juror who sat upon the case
who has not signed the petitions and the
affidavits (are the most of them) made by
persons whom I know to be of the highest

respectability and his neighbors - men who
have known him a long time and
all of whom testify to his irreproachable
character up to the time he was charged
with this offence. I have known
him myself a long time & I solemnly
declare I do not believe he is guilty.
