A.D. 1858, of the Circuit Court of said County
Austin Macon of said County was fined in
the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, for
Assault & Battery, upon the person of his wife

We further show, unto your Excellency
that at the time of the Trial of said Cause,
the said Macon, made no defense that a
reconciliation had, taken place between
himself and wife, and that they were,
then living together peaceably, and that
the said offense had, been committed
while said Macon, was in a state of intox-
-ication, and that no serious damage,
was done, and that the parties are now
living together peaceably,

We would further show, that the said
Macon, is an industrious and peaceable,
Citizen, except when under the influence
of liquor which seldom occurs, and that
he is in limited circumstances, has seven,
small, children, and no means to pay,
said fine, except, to sell his homestead
and deprive his family of a home,
and cause the innocent to suffer,

We would therefore in view of the
circumstances aforesaid respectfully pray
your Excellency, to release him from
said fine, or reduce the same to an

amount that he could pay, without depriving
himself and family of their home which
is now leased on and will be sold,
unless relieved by your Excellency, and
in duty bound we will ever pray &c,
