Nancy Brasswell. Witness heard Mrs Nancy Brasswell
testify in said case as a witness for the State -
Witness heard Mrs Nancy Brasswell testify on the
trial of said case, that Nathaniel N. Waltemore
had entered her house at night with a gun in
his hands, and presented it at her while she was
in her bed - Witness was present on the occasion
referred to when Mrs Nancy Brasswell testified that
Nathaniel N. Waltemore entered her house with
a gun in his hands - Witness states that the
said Nathaniel N. Waltemore did not enter the
House, neither did he have any Gun Pistol or
