Garrison or Williams & Co. Or if it be necessary to give this Agency to an individual, in that case I ask that Price Williams & Co. of the above firm, be appointed; Both Mr. Williams and his Commercial firm, are highly respectable, and stand high here as merchants, and as individuals; There will no doubt be several applicants for this Agency - Among not the number, probably Messrs. St. John Bond & Co., and H B Halcomb & Co. - Each of the above named parties have been opposed to all of our action, and certainly do not deserve benefits that may arise from the sale of the Bonds, or anything else, when we have good strong men, in our party, who are quite as competent, and perhaps more so; Messrs. Williams has been a strong and an

efficient man, in our Cause, and
has freely spent both his time, and
his money, to accomplish what has
been done - and I am sure your
Excellency will appreciate the justice,
and the propriety, of giving any
appointment of this kind to our
friends, and Calabrese, instead of those
who have been working against us.
